This exemption shall extend to include any application for assistance or tax abatement or waiver of a fee, fine or other levy, if based on inability to pay or poverty of the applicant.*

X RSA 91-A:3, II(d) *Consideration of the acquisition, sale or lease of real or personal property which, if discussed in public, would likely benefit a party or parties whose interests are averse to those of the general community.*

____ RSA 91-A:3, II(e) *Consideration or negotiation of pending claims or litigation which has been threatened in writing or filed against this board or any subdivision thereof, or against any member thereof because of his or her membership therein, until the claim or litigation has been fully adjudicated or otherwise settled*

____ RSA 91-A:3, II(i) *Consideration of matters relating to the preparation for and the carrying out of emergency functions, including training to carry out such functions, developed by local or state safety officials that are directly intended to thwart a deliberate act that is intended to result in widespread or severe damage to property or widespread injury or loss of life.*

Description of matters discussed, and final decisions made:

New Elementary School Sites

Repucci presented options of different parcels of land that the school is interested in purchasing to construct a new elementary school. Looking to use federal dollars to close two schools and get rid of all modular by building a new school. Two parcels on Portland Street (706 and 797) would have the least impact to current student zoning and busing. School would be a 350 student school. Lynch explained where the 350 capacity came from based upon analysis. Lynch asked the City seek to negotiate a sale of both property. Repucci said it is an 18 month construction period, so ever delay in purchasing the property pushes the opening date of the school further out and could hurt our application to the Federal Government for monies to pay for the project.
