Hi Again Peter; well the previous regime did things a bit different and common sense was not always part of the plan. When about 15 people per day on average drove into a dead end street, I asked the DPW to put up a sign that says "Dead End" and they did but here is where logic and common sense depart the equation.

At the intersection of Ray Drive and Hussey St, to the right Ray is a dead end, to the Left the street takes you back to Dewey.
