

City of Rochester, NH Preamble for May 26, 2020 City Council Special Meeting and Committee of the Whole Budget Workshop

Good Evening, as Chairperson of the (City Council, Planning Board, Police Commission, ZBA, etc), I am declaring that an emergency exists and I am invoking the provisions of RSA 91-A:2, III (b). Federal, state, and local officials have determined that gatherings of 10 or more people pose a substantial risk to our community in its continuing efforts to combat the spread of COVID-19. In concurring with their determination, I also find that this meeting is imperative to the continued operation of City government and services, which are vital to public safety and confidence during this emergency. As such, this meeting will be conducted without a quorum of this body physically present in the same location.

SUMMARY STATEMENT

Gov. Chris Sununu announced \$300 weekly stipends for first responders in the state will be paid through federal funding from the CARES Act funding during the new coronavirus pandemic. This includes full-time firefighters and police officers. Part-timers will get \$150 a week. The period of eligibility is May 4, 2020 – June 30, 2020. Additional information can be found here: FIRST RESPONDER STIPENDS.

Since the stipends are not *mandated* by the governor, they would be a benefit the City is choosing to provide. And since it is a term and condition of employment, the unions have the right to negotiate and the City Council (CC) to approve. As a result, I seek approval from the CC to apply for these funds and pay them over to our first responders. If the CC does approve, I will send a simple notice to the unions informing them that the CC has granted permission to apply for these stipends in accordance with the terms outlined by the Governor and the Department of Safety and stating that unless the union objects by (June 1st) these stipends will be paid to all eligible employees.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval to apply for and pay out first responder stipends.
